## Metro East Sprint Meet >>>

### A big meet with big results!

Well done to the 32 swimmers that represented the Club at Metro East Sprint Meet. Most came chasing State Sprint times, some achieved this but all left with bucket loads of Personal Best times. Some great swims included Rebecca Owens amazing 50m Breaststroke in 38.50 a 2 second improvement. Another stand out was new comer Travis Arnol who surprised many with this quick fire 36 50 Fs and 1.22 100 Fs. But none another shocked as much as Myee Steveson who came out flying in her 50m Fs to be a body length in front by 25m and go on to win her heat in a 31.65 to make her the 3<sup>rd</sup> fastest female in the Club and assure her a relay berth and her first state time!

I could keep going on and on but quite simply it was a great meet!

Edward Sims:

1 Relay swim, broke 30 mark on lead off leg! First event at States.

Myee Stevenson:

2 Relay swims, broke 33 mark as the anchor in medley relay! First event at States
